MR. JOHN EARLE NEWTON

Mr. John Earle Newton, the distinguished pianist, conductor and lecturer, is head of the Department of Composition at the Master Institute of Roerich Museum.

Mr. Newton is also the Director of Music and Executive Officer of the Division of Fine Arts at New Jersey College for Women, New Brunswick, N. J.

The composers whose lives and works are to be discussed in these two series of lectures have been chosen primarily because of their importance in the development of the art of music and also because, in the majority of cases, they are either almost entirely unknown to or decidedly underestimated by many students and lovers of music.

It is, of course, impossible to include in twenty lectures all of the important names among Twentieth Century Composers, but it is hoped that, by means of what might be termed a cross-section of representative contemporary music, these courses may provide much of interest both to the initiate and to the person who desires an introduction to the spirit and language of present-day musical composition.

Mr. Newton will illustrate his lectures at the piano.
