In her talks Miss Grant will discuss the comparative concepts of the Various Philosophies on Such Beliefs as the Existence of God; Death and Immortality; Karma, the Law of Retribution; Reincarnation as the School of Life; Man and His Bodies; Man as a Citizen of the Cosmos; World Saviours; the Hope of the Future.

Frances R. Grant, B. Lit., Columbia, distinguished writer and lecturer, regarded as one of the outstanding authorities on the Philosophies of Asia, is Vice President of the Roerich Museum. Long a contributor to numerous magazines, Miss Grant has lectured extensively not only through the United States, but through the Universities and Museums of Brazil, Argentine, Chile, Bolivia, Columbia, Mexico, Peru, India, etc. Her latest work "Oriental Philosophies" will be issued in November, 1935, by the Dial Press; another book, "Flambeaux", Lives of the Western Mystics, will be published during the coming year.
