



Master Institute of United Arts wishes to announce that with the opening of its School activities on October 1st, Lehman Engel, American composer and conductor, will head the department of Musical Theory, offering class and private instruction in Theory, Harmony, Counterpoint, Composition, Orchestration, and Analysis of Forms according to grade.

Mr. Engel will instruct without textbook and will draw musical examples for illustration from masterworks of the present as well as from those of the past. Creative work on the part of the students will be encouraged and the accent in teaching will fall more heavily in the direction of the "musical" than the "academic".

Believing that experience is one of the most vital factors in learning an art, Mr. Engel will endeavor wherever possible to start with student-composition rather than with abstract theory. Without considering a basic difference between "modern" and "classic art, music of all periods will be considered in the study of harmony, counterpoint, orchestration, and analysis of form.

The fee for the course under Mr. Engel, from October to June, covering 36 weeks, is \$54 for the season, payable in two payments of \$27 each, or \$7 monthly.

Beginning Wednesday evening, October 23rd and continuing each week until December 11th, Mr. Engel will offer eight lectures comprising the first semester of a series entitled:

All lectures will be illustrated with appropriate soloists or with small ensembles. The fee for the 8 lectures comprising the first semester is \$5.00.

The remaining eight lectures of the second semester will begin with Romantic Music and conclude with Present Day Music in Europe as well as in America.
